What is Youth Parliament?

Youth Parliament is the Y NSW's flagship leadership and civic engagement program that empowers young people to have a voice in Parliament and in their community.

We are an apolitical program

Regardless of who you are, and what you believe in, the Youth Parliament Program caters for all. We are not affiliated to any political parties and encourage diverse opinions and thoughts in the program!



We'll teach you the skills

Whilst at Youth Parliament, you will get the opportunity to learn about Parliamentary processes and writing legislation, and gain skills in public speaking and leadership. You don't need to have any prior experience to participate - just come ready to learn!

Speak in Parliament of NSW

During our Residential Camp in July, all Youth Members gather in Parliament of NSW to discuss the issues that matter to you. You will be a Youth Member of Parliament for the week, sitting in the Chamber, debating bills and giving speeches.



Meet with Members of Parliament

During Youth Sitting Week, there are opportunities to meet various Members of Parliament as they guest chair the parliamentary sessions during the week.

Have your voice heard

After Residential Camp, Youth Members will have the opportunity to share their Bills with various key stakeholders and advocate the issues that young people of NSW are passionate about and want to see addressed. Maybe your Bill could influence future legislation!



How does it all work?



You are chosen as a representative of your electorate

E.g. The Youth Member for Leppington.

In your application, you will state the electorate that you currently reside in, which you'll be representing throughout Youth Parliament and is the title you will hold during sessions. In addition to this, you will also be a member of either the government or opposition.



You are allocated as a member of a committee

E.g. A member of the Justice Committee.

In your application form you will be able to select your top three committee preferences, for example Education, Mental Health, Justice. Committees have between 8-10 people in them and together you will write a Youth Bill on a chosen topic within that relevant portfolio.



Attend a 3 day Training Camp in April

Training Camp will be in Sydney, NSW

Training Camp is where the cohort first come together and learn all the important skills that you need to participate in the program. Training Camp will cover advocacy and leadership skills, parliamentary education, public speaking and more.



Writing a Youth Bill with your committee

E.g. A Bill to introduce an increase of school hours

As a committee, you will decide on a topic, research existing legislation, engage in community consultations and write a Youth Bill that addresses an issue in the community. We will guide you step by step on how to do this, and you will be supported by Taskforce volunteers.



Attend Residential Camp and Youth Sitting Week

Have the opportunity to speak during each session

In July, you will attend a 6-day Residential Camp which includes 4-days of parliamentary sittings at Parliament of NSW. During this time, each committee will present their Youth Bill and have it debated and voted on by all members. You will also present speeches on your electorate, and other issues that are important to you.

Who can apply?

You are eligible to apply if you are:



A young person in years 10 - 12 in high school

To participate in the Y NSW Youth Parliament, you must be in years 10 - 12 for the full duration of the 2025 program.





Only young people living in the state of New South Wales are eligible to participate.

How much will it cost?

The Y NSW is committed to ensuring the Youth Parliament program is accessible to young people. Each year, the Y actively seeks funding to cover as much of the cost as possible to reduce the fee for participants.



The cost to participate in the Youth Parliament program is **\$1400**. This fee covers all accommodation and meals for both camps, transport to and from Parliament House, workshops, activities and materials during the program.

First Nations scholarships

We are proud to offer a select number of First Nations scholarships for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people. Please indicate in your application if you would like to be considered for one of these scholarships.

Financial barriers

If the cost of Youth Parliament is a barrier for you to participate in the program, please indicate this in your application, and we will endeavour to support you to raise the funds. Many young people seek support to raise funds from their community which includes their school, local MP, rotary clubs and other community organisations.

- · Make sure the video is 2 minutes or less.
- · Save your video file as 'YP25_Application_Firstname Lastname'

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Submit your video

Choose the format to submit your video:



Upload Video to Application Form (max size 50MB)

- · Record your video.
- Upload video to the Application Form when prompted.
- Allowed types are .mov and .mp4



Email (max size 10MB)

- · Sign up or log in to your email
- · Compose an email and attach your video
- Add the subject line 'YP25 Video Application First Name Last Name'
- · Email to youthparliament@ymcansw.org.au

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Finish Your Application

- · Indicate in the application that you have submitted your video.
- Make sure all questions are answered
- · Submit your application.


